

Worksheet 1: The Helpful Elephant

Passage: The Helpful Elephant (Approx. 130 words)

Toto was a kind and gentle elephant who loved to wander by the river. One afternoon, he heard a sound that wasn't a bird or the wind—it was a quiet, scared whimper. Toto followed the noise until he saw a small deer whose leg was caught tightly between two fallen logs. The deer looked very frightened and couldn't pull free.

Toto knew he had to help. He bravely walked up and carefully pushed one of the heavy logs with his strong trunk, just enough to loosen the trap. The deer quickly pulled its leg out and ran a short distance before stopping. It turned back, looked at Toto, and gently bowed its head as if to say, "Thank you." From that day on, the deer would often follow Toto on his walks, and the two became lifelong friends. Toto learned that **kindness** is the greatest strength.

Questions

1. **Moral Understanding:** What is the most important lesson Toto learned in the story?
 2. **Sequencing Events:** What did Toto do *before* the deer was able to pull its leg out?
 3. **Identifying Main Ideas:** Choose the best title for this story: a) Toto's River Walk b) Kindness and a New Friend c) Logs by the River
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Worksheet 2: The Busy Bees

Passage: The Busy Bees (Approx. 130 words)

Busy bees are tiny, winged workers that do one of the most important jobs on Earth. They start their day by flying out to colorful flowers to collect **nectar**, a sweet liquid. As they drink the nectar, tiny yellow **pollen** sticks to the fuzzy hair on their bodies. When the bees fly to the next flower, they drop off some of that pollen, which helps the plants make new seeds and grow. This is called **pollination**.

Once they return to the hive, the bees transform the nectar they collected into thick, golden **honey**. This delicious honey is stored in the hive and serves as food for the whole colony. Because of their hard work, bees not only feed their families but also help flowers, fruits, and vegetables grow for us. This shows that the smallest creatures can make the biggest difference.

Questions

1. **Informational Reading:** What are the two main things a bee collects from a flower?
 2. **Cause and Effect:** What is the *effect* of bees dropping off pollen on the next flower they visit?
 3. **Vocabulary Building:** What is another word for the sweet liquid bees collect?
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Worksheet 3: The Missing Sandwich

Passage: The Missing Sandwich (Approx. 130 words)

Lily set her peanut butter and jelly sandwich on the picnic blanket and went to get her juice box. "I'll just be a minute!" she told her puppy, Max, who was happily chewing on a toy nearby. When she returned, Lily gasped! The sandwich was gone. There were no people around, and the blanket was far from the table. "A sandwich thief!" she whispered, looking for clues.

She first noticed a little smear of peanut butter on the edge of the blanket. Then, she saw a trail of tiny purple jelly spots leading toward the dogwood tree. Lily quietly followed the spots, her heart thumping. Suddenly, she heard a soft, happy *munch, munch* sound. She peeked around the tree and saw her silly puppy, Max, carefully licking the last bits of jelly from the crust! He looked up with a guilty but satisfied tail wag. Lily laughed; the mystery was solved.

Questions

1. **Inference:** Why did Lily first think a "sandwich thief" took her food?
 2. **Prediction:** What do you think Lily will do with Max after she finds him with the sandwich?
 3. **Comprehension:** What were the two main clues that helped Lily solve the mystery?
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Worksheet 4: The Trip to the Mountains

Passage: The Trip to the Mountains (Approx. 130 words)

Ali and his family drove high up into the great, towering mountains. The trees changed from green and brown to towering pines covered in white. It was their first time seeing snow! When they arrived, a **blizzard** of tiny, cold snowflakes was swirling through the air. Ali bundled up in his thickest coat, hat, and fuzzy mittens before stepping out of the car.

The air was sharp and clean, making Ali's cheeks tingle. He looked up at the mountains, which seemed like giants wearing white cloaks. He took a huge breath and felt a **joyful** shout bubbling up inside him. He bent down and scooped up a handful of the powdery, icy snow. It felt like cold sugar! Questions

1. **Descriptive Reading:** Name two words the author used to describe the air or the snow.
 2. **Summarizing:** In one sentence, what is the main idea of this passage?
 3. **Emotional Understanding:** How did Ali most likely feel when he stepped out and saw the snow?
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Worksheet 5: The Farmer's Garden

Passage: The Farmer's Garden (Approx. 130 words)

Meet Mr. Ahmed, the kindest farmer in the valley. His garden was not just a place to grow food; it was a special, green paradise. Every morning, Mr. Ahmed walked through his rows of plump tomatoes and tall green beans, speaking softly to his plants. "Good morning, little friend," he would whisper to a sunflower. He believed that talking to them made them feel happy and grow stronger.

Mr. Ahmed taught children that a great garden is built on **respect** and **responsibility**. He never used chemicals, preferring to pull the pesky **weeds** by hand. He would carefully examine the leaves of his plants, looking for any tiny **pests** that might cause trouble. Questions

1. **Observation:** Name two different types of plants mentioned in Mr. Ahmed's garden.
 2. **Detail Comprehension:** What is one specific thing Mr. Ahmed does every morning in his garden?
 3. **Vocabulary:** What are "weeds" and why does the farmer pull them out?

Worksheet 1: The Helpful Elephant

1. **Moral Understanding:** The most important lesson is that kindness (or helping others) is the greatest strength.

Worksheet 2: The Busy Bees

1. **Informational Reading:** They collect **nectar** and **pollen**.
2. **Cause and Effect:** The plants make new seeds and grow (this is called pollination).
3. **Vocabulary Building:** Nectar.

Worksheet 3: The Missing Sandwich

1. **Inference:** She thought a thief took it because she was only gone for a minute, she was far from the table, and no one else was around.
2. **Prediction:** (Answers may vary, but should be logical, e.g., Lily will laugh, she will scold him gently, or she will make another sandwich for herself.)
3. **Comprehension:** The two clues were the smear of peanut butter on the blanket and the trail of tiny purple jelly spots.

Worksheet 4: The Trip to the Mountains

1. **Descriptive Reading:** *Air*: sharp, clean. *Snow*: cold, powdery, icy. (Accept any two from the passage.)
2. **Summarizing:** Ali and his family took a trip to the mountains and experienced the exciting adventure of seeing and playing in snow for the first time.
3. **Emotional Understanding:** He felt excited, joyful, or happy.

Worksheet 5: The Farmer's Garden

1. **Observation:** Plump tomatoes, tall green beans, and sunflower(s). (Accept any two.)
2. **Detail Comprehension:** He walks through his rows of plants and speaks softly to them.
3. **Vocabulary:** Weeds are unwanted plants that grow in a garden. The farmer pulls them out by hand so they don't harm the desired plants.
